

Recognition of ECTS credits at the University of Dąbrowa Górnicza

The University of Dąbrowa Górnicza is committed to recognition of mobility achievements in study and traineeship. Mobility studies based on the Learning Agreement delivered at host institution and are recognized by the University and contribute to the student overall study. Evaluation of students achievements during traineeship is based on Learning Programme and certificate of traineeship attendance issued by training provider which specifies student's training record, tasks performed and skills acquired. Recording achievements of incoming students is done based on Transcript of Records, provided to incoming student/their Institutional Programme Coordinator at the end of a mobility period and within timeline defined in inter-institutional agreement.

Students participating in ECTS will receive full credit for all academic work successfully carried out at any of the ECTS partner institutions. These academic credits will be transferred from one participating school to another provided there are agreements between the institutions involved. The student remains a degree student at his/her home university, to which he/she returns after a specified period spent studying abroad. ECTS enables the student to have all courses successfully completed abroad recognised without loss of time or credit. Once the host institution has sent the 'Transcript of Records', credit transfer can take place at the home institution. A student may be selected for more than one participating institution for a limited period of time and then return to the home institution. If a student chooses to stay at a host institution to complete his/her degree, the student's status changes and she/he must comply with the legal and institutional requirements of the country and the institution where the degree will be completed. ECTS is particularly important and useful for students participating in international study programmes (LLP, ERASMUS, FSS, etc.).

Students participating in traineeships do not get ECTS points. Therefore, they have to pass all exams at home institution. However, they are granted Individual Organization of Studies which gives them more flexibility and enables them to pass the semester without any problems. Additionally, the Erasmus mobility experience is mentioned in the supplement to the diploma.

The allocation of credits at our institution depends on the year of studies, number of semesters that a course lasts and the individual work that a student must do in order to pass the course. The more additional work students have, the more ECTS points are given to a certain subject. Students are obliged to gain minimum 30 ECTS points for one semester, 60 for the whole year.
